#### 1. Executive Session

# 1.01 Negotiations Direction with District Employees regarding the JCEA Tentative Agreement and Fact Finding

As the Board of Education held its discussion in open session, the superintendent provided background on the contractual matters and requested the Board add a Discussion agenda item to accept or reject the Fact Finders recommendation while recommending that the Board reject the Fact Finders recommendation.

Board discussion covered having a fair, valid, reliable method of evaluation and having an effective teacher in every classroom by aligning resources and the compensation system with that goal. Mr. Witt presented a diagram of a model for teacher compensation for the \$18.2 million set aside that would raise the lowest paid teachers to \$38,000 if rated effective or probationary with teachers with a salary above \$38,000/year receiving a percentage increase based on their rating of effective or highly effective. Discussion of the model covered how the salary plan was not presented earlier to Board members and teachers, if the model will recruit and retain effective teachers, that it increases the pay of new teachers and every effective teacher will receive a raise for the first time in three years. Mr. Witt recommended specific action be taken on the model at the next meeting. (Attachment A)
