



## Rtl Communication Tips

- 1) Talk to your child about how things are going at school. Regularly check their work and attendance.
- 2) Communicate with your child's teacher regarding his or her progress.
- 3) When concerns or questions arise, first request a meeting with your child's teacher and/or counselor to discuss the concerns.
- 4) If the concern continues, contact the school principal if needed.
- 5) If the problem is not resolved at the school site, contact the Community Superintendents' Office at 303-982-6611.
